Safety Guidelines

These guidelines will be modified periodically as restrictions are lifted.

Health & Safety Protocols:

- For the health and safety of our patrons and employees please do NOT come to the rink in the following instances:
 - You are showing symptoms of COVID-19 such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, or a new loss of taste or smell.
 - You have been in close contact with someone infected by COVID-19.
 - You have tested positive for COVID-19.
 - A health care provider or public health official has recommended you to quarantine for any reason related to COVID-19

Masks, gloves & skates:

- Everyone MUST wear face masks from the time they leave their vehicle, until they get back in it. Face masks and gloves are required both on and off the ice.
- Skaters must have their own skates as rentals will not be available.
- There will be no use of locker rooms. Bags must be left in your vehicle.

Arriving at the rink:

- Customers are asked to arrive no sooner than 15 minutes prior to the start of the session.
- Enter the rink using the Rink C main entrance for all classes.
- Maintain social distance when entering and while inside the rink. No congregating in parking lots.
- Traffic patterns will be clearly marked on the floor to Rink entrance.
- Skaters will get on the ice as soon as they arrive and go to their class area.
- 1 parent/guardian per skater, may walk the skater into the building while wearing a mask, no siblings. Parents are asked to remain outside of the rink or in their cars during the session.

Late arrival to rink:

- Entrance doors to the rink will close 1 minute before the start of the session.
- Skaters late to the rink will NOT be allowed to skate under any circumstances.

On the ice:

- Face masks and gloves are required both on and off the ice.
- Skaters will have 40 minutes of supervised class time without practice time.
- Each class will be assigned a specific area of the ice in order to keep skaters a safe distance apart.
- At the end of the session, skaters will maintain social distance while exiting the ice.

Other:

- Staff will continuously clean front doors, door handles, etc.
- No loitering or socializing inside the building.
- Only one person is allowed in the bathroom at a time.
